

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

CIIT was established in 1998 as a Center of Excellence of Commission on Science and Technology for Sustainable Development in the South (COMSATS) with a vision to revolutionize the higher education paradigm. The CIIT has completed its 16 years and it is delightful to share that the Institute has been continuously improving, and the year 2015-16 is no exception.

This Annual report starts with an overview of the Institute, highlighting some important facts like mission, vision, and structure of Institute. The first chapter befittingly covers the academic activities describing the variety of programs being offered at CIIT. CIIT is proud to have 3-star rating by the QS for its quality education and services. This chapter highlights the foreign academic and institutional linkages with 39 MoUs signed during the reporting period.


The chapter two elaborates the Research and Development activities, be it in terms of projects, publications, conferences, seminars, and workshops. The detail of those held during the reporting period is incorporated in this chapter. Few of the major workshops/seminars/ symposia include Technomoot, Frontiers of Information Technology (FIT), SAICON, Pak-China Business Forum, Global Forum on Islamic Finance, etc. The chapter also provides information about the research collaborations and activities, significantly, the research publications during 2015 reached to a figure of 1,263 making a total of 5,632. The Institute has also filed 13 patents for registration during the reporting period.

CIIT also has the honor of being ISO 9000:2008 certified, which is the most popular standard of Quality Management System internationally. The third chapter is about Quality Assurance and significant steps taken in ensuring quality of teaching and research in the Institute.

CIIT understands the importance of competent faculty and to provide them with opportunities for growth and development. Chapter four describes the faculty development at CIIT which is the largest faculty development program among the universities/institutions of higher education in the country. The faculty members stand at a figure of 3,159 during the reporting period including 1,042 PhDs. Until June 30, 2016, 506 scholars have returned and rejoined CIIT after completing their higher studies abroad. Faculty Development Academy (FDA) of the Institute has continued to provide pre-service and in-service trainings to cater the training needs of the faculty. International faculty is also engaged in order to provide diversity among the faculty.

Chapter five enlists the basic facts about the students like enrollment, equity, and faculty-student ratio, etc. The student enrollment as of June 30, 2016 is 35,413. The highest enrollment was observed in Faculty of Information Sciences and Technology with 13,282 students.

The next chapter, Universities Building Economies, contains the information on linkages established with the industry and the activities of Business Incubation Center (BIC) in promoting entrepreneurship. The Institute understands and realizes its duty of providing students



with as all possible help and guidance during their stay at CIIT. In order to help them in their career development, CIIT has established internship and placement offices at its campuses which are also responsible for career counseling of the students. Different workshops/seminars are organized by these offices to make students aware of the challenges they may face in their careers.

Chapter seven and eight highlight the strengthening of physical and technological infrastructure including details of development and construction projects, research equipment, digital library, PERN, video conferencing, etc. Until the end of FY 2015-16, CIIT has completed 48 development projects, while 02 projects are on-going. New research equipment was purchased during the reporting period at campuses. The library at CIIT provides access to more than 33,000 high quality journals/articles/databases through HEC's Digital Library

provision. Chapter nine provides information about the public service activities, which CIIT feels its obligations.

Besides teaching and learning, sports and co-curricular activities are very helpful in developing strong personalities and instilling various traits. The events held/participated in this regard during the reporting period are elaborated in chapter ten and eleven. The next chapter provides financial information while chapter thirteen covers the paradigm of University Governance. Chapter fourteen highlights Office of Development, its initiatives and future plans. The report in hand ends with chapter fifteen, which provides generic details about medical/health facilities available at campuses of CIIT, and counseling service being provided for stress reduction. The report concludes with relevant annexure supplementing the information contained in the report.



Its futurist leadership, relentless positive energy, and fervent human resource earned CIIT a Degree Awarding Charter from the Government of Pakistan in 2000.

CIIT is a multi-campus Institute offering assorted degree programs in the fields of Science, Engineering, Technology, Architecture, Design, Business, etc. Currently, there are seven functional campuses of CIIT at Islamabad, Abbottabad, Wah, Lahore, Attock, Sahiwal, and Vehari along with a Virtual Campus and a few more are in the pipeline.

Teaching and Learning





Academic Achievements

Award of Laptops:

CIIT organized an impressive laptop distribution ceremony on June 24, 2016 at its Islamabad Campus during which laptops were distributed to 646 MS and PhD students, under Phase-II of the Prime Minister's Scheme. The excited students received the latest laptop machines with specifications enabling them to be used

both as a computer and as well as a notepad. In addition, an Internet device was also the part of the package. The chief guest at the ceremony was Chairman Higher Education Commission (HEC) Prof. Dr. Mukhtar Ahmed. Overall, 1,856 students were awarded laptops under the scheme during 2015-16.



First Ever Ground Stations in Pakistan:

Earth and Atmospheric Remote Sensing Research at the department of Meteorology, CIIT Islamabad developed first ever ground stations in Pakistan to monitor air pollution in Islamabad using Atmospheric Light Detection And Ranging (LIDAR) and hand held sun photometer in November, 2015 and are placed at CIIT Islamabad. These stations are portable.

Convocations:



Till June 30, 2016, CIIT has produced 37,121 graduates out of which 151 are PhDs. During the reporting period, 5,957

graduates were produced including 33 PhDs.



Foreign Academic Linkages

Establishing foreign academic linkages has gained paramount significance over the years. Identifying and exploring the various areas of collaboration such as joint research, student and faculty exchange, joint conferences, and other academic activities, has become one of the key areas for educational institutions.

During the reporting period, 28 international MoUs were signed with the reputed institutions and organizations from China, Belarus, Azerbaijan, Russia, Maldives, Tunisia, South Korea, Turkey, and UK. 230 international MoUs have been signed so far.

Also in order to benefit from a mutuality of purpose, 11 national MoUs with prestigious higher education institutions and R&D organizations representing various provinces of Pakistan were conceived and signed. 80 national MoUs have been signed so far. The list of MoUs is provided at Annexure (A).

The detail of few of these linkages is as follows:

The Physical - Technical Institute of the National Academy of Sciences, Belarus: A MoU was signed on August 12, 2015. The main areas of cooperation will be to promote the scientific education and research, to strengthen respective research and development policies; to encourage exchange of scientific information and exchange of scientists and researchers, to promote and implement research

projects, to conduct joint seminars, workshops, symposia, and training programs.

- University of Tunis El Manar, Tunisia: A MoU was signed on December 10, 2015 to promote exchange of teacher and students, conduct joint research projects and training programs. The highlight of the MoU will be cooperation to develop libraries.
- Sejong University, South Korea: A MoU was signed on January 29, 2016 to promote research projects and joint programs besides exchange of teachers and students.
- ▲ Turkmen State Institute of Economics and Management, Turkmenistan: A MoU was signed on March 16, 2016. According to the MOU, the main areas of cooperation will be exchange of experience in the field of training and research in Economics, Statistics, Environment Protection, Business Administration, Project Management, Banking and Finance, Strategic Marketing and other related disciplines.
- Tomsk State University, Russia: A MoU was signed on May 22, 2016 to collaborate in various areas. According to the MOU, the main areas of cooperation will be exchange of scholars, staff, graduate and undergraduate students, exchange of academic information and materials, joint research activities and publications, participation in conferences and academic meetings and other academic exchanges that both universities agree to. Also, four students

- ▲ Istanbul University, Turkey: A MoU was signed on May 23, 2016 to collaborate in various areas. According to the MOU, the main areas of cooperation will be exchange of scholars, staff, graduate and undergraduate students, exchange of academic information and materials, joint research activities and publications, participation in conferences and academic meetings and other academic exchanges that both universities agree to.

Institutional Linkages

- ▶ United Nations Information Center (UNIC),
 Pakistan: CIIT has worked in collaboration with
 UNIC, several times in the past years on issues of
 development goals and climate change. However, on
 February 23, 2015, this partnership was cemented
 with the launch of a significant design competition
 followed by the signing of a MoU. It will help to
 champion and integrate the global human rights
 values that UN promotes, within all CIIT campuses.
- ▲ ZTE Corporation, China: A MoU was signed on July 15, 2015 for establishment of smart park and smart Campus.
- ▲ Islamic Finance Council UK Limited: A MoU was signed on July 21, 2015 to promote exchange in the area of Islamic banking and finance through joint research, provision of skilled and committed manpower, collaboration in conducting professional training, and exchange of faculty and trainers.
- African-Asian Rural Development Organization (AARDO): A MoU was signed on September 03, 2015.

- It will promote sharing of information, knowledge and resources, and joint implementation of development projects.
- The Promotion of Education in Pakistan (PEP) Foundation Inc., USA: A MoU was signed on November 10, 2015 to establish Student Start-up Business Center (SSBC) at CIIT.
- The Institute of International Relations of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Turkmenistan: A MoU was signed on March 16, 2016. The areas covered under the MoU include professional training of public and private sector personnel in the field of public policy, mutual exchange of information related to such thematic areas as security and foreign policy, general economic and financial matters, development issues, science, technology and innovation, gender and other areas identified through mutual agreement.
- Inter Islamic Network on Science and Technology Parks (INSTP), Iran: On the sidelines of the 15th session of the General Assembly meeting of the OIC Ministerial Standing Committee on Scientific and Technological Cooperation (COMSTECH) held from May 31- June 01, 2016 in Islamabad, a meeting was held between the Executive Director, INIT and Dr. M. Mottaghitalab, Secretary General INSTP, Guilan, Iran. Subsequent to the discussion held in the said meeting, the two Networks entered into a MoU. The proceeding took place in the presence of Dr. Vahid Ahmadi, Deputy Minister for Research and Technology, Government of Islamic Republic of Iran. The two Networks agreed to continue their growth with increased cooperation and the same level of exuberance that has always been the distinguishing factor for INIT. The MoU consisted of articles detailing the areas which shall be the focus for collaborations. The areas included promotion of pre-



defined programs by both the Networks such as capacity building, promoting training with joint research and development activities, participation in conferences and academic meetings, facilitating the exchange of staff, information and materials and other exchanges that both organizations agree to, with the belief that the research and education process at both organizations would be enhanced.

Visits of Foreign Delegations

In order to promote CIIT's international profile, the Ambassadors, High Commissioners, Heads of Foreign Delegations and International Agencies are invited regularly to visit CIIT. Eminent foreign scholars visiting Pakistan are also invited to deliver lectures and talks to faculty and students. During the reporting period, few of the visits arranged were as follows:

- Prof. Dr. Mhmet Ali Yukselen, Rector, and Associate Prof. Dr. Carolina Smochina, Vice Rector, from the European University of Lefke, North Cyprus visited CIIT on November 10, 2015. The delegation took a stroll around the campus and was impressed by the campus ambience and facilities. Both Rectors showed keen willingness for partnership and swapped literature and souvenirs.
- On November 11, 2015, CIIT Islamabad became host to Mr. Carl Jones, International Manager and Mr. Hassan Shariq, Country representative from Deakin University, Australia. A meeting was held to explore opportunities for collaborative partnership.
- Dr. Daniel Mattern, the newly posted Country Cultural Affairs Officer along with Ms. Nadia Kamran, Senior Cultural Affairs Specialist of the U.S. Embassy visited CIIT Islamabad on December 15, 2015. CHAPTER 02

Research and Development

An Overview

From its humble beginnings in 1998 with barely a dozen faculty members and a couple of hundred students, CIIT is now among the top five large universities and the number one (1) Information Technology institute in the country. On the research forefront, CIIT is number two (2) in the nation. CIIT is dedicated to advancement of learning and extending the frontiers of knowledge. The Institute's mission is threefold, i.e. Research and Discovery, Teaching and Learning, and Outreach and Public Service. Its mission supports and promotes knowledge creation in academically diverse disciplines and to the application of this knowledge to benefit the people.

CIIT's mission meshes very well with its strategic aim of developing a knowledge economy benefitting socioeconomic environment in the country. To fulfill this purpose, the Office of Research, Innovation and Commercialization (ORIC) was established in 2011 with the aim of linking university research directly with educational, social and economic priorities of CIIT and its broader community. Its slogan is "Creating endless opportunities by transforming research into prosperity."

The ORIC at CIIT operates with the following Terms of Reference:

- ▲ Enhancing research culture
- ♣ Promoting inter/cross disciplinary research
- ▲ Building university industry linkages
- ▲ Inculcating entrepreneurship among researchers

- ▲ Generating intellectual property through research, innovation, and commercialization
- ▲ Establishing technology/innovation/business parks
- Catalyzing technology transfer through spin off companies and licensing
- Augmenting capacity building of research/corporate community

Operations of ORIC

During the reporting period, following activities were carried out through ORIC:

CIIT Research Grant Program (CRGP)

In order to attract young faculty into the research mainstream, a CRGP is in place to award grants up to Rs. 200,000/- for research proposals of 1-2 years duration. During the reporting period, under this program, 50 research proposals were approved / released to the awardees. Currently, 35 research proposals are ready to be reviewed in the forthcoming CRGP meeting.

ORIC-Professional Development (ORIC-PD)

For building prosperous careers, individuals and organizations need to continuously refresh their knowledge, education and training. In order to cater to this demand the ORIC-PD was established in 2013. The overarching objective of the program is to explore practical application of knowledge through direct interaction with industry practitioners and policy-makers.

During the reporting period, following trainings were organized under ORIC- Professional Development Program:

- Two Days Training Workshop on Designing and Implementing Field Research, September 16-17, 2015: The training program was beneficial for understanding and implementation of field research in both industry and academia. The workshop mainly focused on research design, instrument development, sample design, field plan, data collection methods, along with budgeting to carry out the research efficiently. It unraveled some of the mystique surrounding survey research and helped participants to strengthen their knowledge and skills to design and undertake field surveys.
- Quantitative Research Techniques using SPSS, February 10-11, 2016: This emphasis of the training was on building and fostering competencies in data processing methodologies, techniques and interpretation of results. Since proficiency with statistical software package is indispensable for serious research in sciences, the training was designed for apprehension of methods of quantitative research with case studies.
- Two Days Hands-On Workshop on Critical Thinking and Developing Research Problems, February 24-25, 2016: The training focused on defining a research problem and issues associated with it such as critical evaluation, formation of a hypothesis and defining research objectives. Real life scenarios were employed to define the problems making the training more effective and retention of methods taught during the course more plausible. The workshop was aimed for individuals working regularly with data analysis particularly early career researchers/industry professionals and students preparing for submission of a thesis.
- One Day Training Workshop on Effective Professional Writing, March 29-30, 2016: The aim of this workshop was to help produce effective and result oriented workplace related writing including emails, memos, letters and short reports.






Research Publications

Products Developed by Center for Advanced Studies in Telecommunication (CAST)

- Remote Phone Access is an android based mobile application, developed by CAST in August 2015 with the aim to access a mobile phone remotely. If one forgets his phone at home, he/she can access it using simple SMS commands from any other phone to retrieve SMS and Call notifications as well as other features including phone lock, contact fetch, etc. The application has recorded more than 92,000 downloads from Google Play store.
- A compact plug and play DC current and voltage measurement device was developed in January 2016. The device can measure, display and log the real time current from two power lines. The device has built-in microcontroller which sends data to any remote location through IP hence the data can be monitored remotely from anywhere. The major application of this system is in industrial grade power backup systems, solar systems and construction

- machinery to evaluate their power efficiency.
- An android currency identification application was developed in March 2016 to assist blind people, which can correctly detect the Pakistani currency bills by pointing them towards mobile camera. The color detection features correctly identifies if the copy of currency bill is pointed towards it.



Conferences, Seminars, and Workshops

Conferences, Seminars, and workshops are the major source of gathering new information and to exchange ideas on the trends in research, upcoming technologies, and much more. It is also a platform to network with the people from various fields and benefit from their experience. CIIT since its inception has arranged numerous conferences, seminars, and workshops for the benefit of its faculty, students, and staff as well as community at large. The detail of the important ones held during the reporting period is given below:



5th International Training Workshop on Internet Security- Enhancing Information Exchange Safeguards: The Inter Islamic Network on Information Technology (INIT) convened this workshop from September 14-18, 2015 at Ankara, Turkey. It was the 5th edition of this very successful training workshop series being organized by INIT since 2011. The other collaborating partner institutions with INIT included Islamic Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organizations (ISESCO), Commission on Science and Technology for Sustainable Development in the South (COMSATS), Statistical, Economic and Social Research and Training Centre for Islamic Countries (SESRIC) Turkey, and CIIT

Islamabad. Spanned over a period of 5 days, the workshop was inaugurated by Prof. A. Arif Ergin, President, Scientific and Technological Research Council of Turkey, Govt. of Turkey. The workshop provided a forum to the participating researchers and professionals to learn about the latest advancements in the field of internet security; the use of state-of-the-art technologies for protection of network and network accessible resources from different types of software attacks; and working out effective internet/information security solutions for general public, governmental organizations and commercial enterprises through rigorous risk analyses and security management approaches.

3rd Regional Consultative Workshop on National **Innovation System and Intellectual Property** (Arab Region): The INIT convened this workshop from October 05 - 07, 2015 at Tunis, Tunisian Republic. The INIT is the lead proponent and organizer of this workshop series. The other collaborating partners with INIT included ISESCO and COMSATS. This series of workshop is aimed at strengthening the capability of senior academicians and planners from the Member States of OIC and COMSATS to understand and possibly help develop national policies for improving innovation and IP frameworks, as well as enabling them to respond effectively to the challenges of building competitive economies during rapid globalization and technological change. The Workshop was attended by around twenty four (24) participants/resource persons from 13 institutions from China, Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Malaysia, Mauritania, Morocco, Pakistan,

Seminar on Human Rights Education and Sensitization: CPS in collaboration with the Ministry of Law, Justice and Human Rights organized a one-day seminar on "Human Rights Education and Sensitization" on October 08, 2015. Senator Nuzhat Sadiq, Chairperson Senate Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs and Commissioner Pakistan Girls Guide Association was the Chief Guest. Throughout the seminar the students took active part in discussions and gave their own recommendations and opinions on the basis of their observation and experience on a daily basis.

Roundtable on Water Security Challenges in Pakistan: A Roundtable discussion on Water Security Challenges in Pakistan was organized by Centre for Policy Studies (CPS), CIIT on November 11, 2015. Rector, CIIT said that the need of the hour is to generate a societal debate to resolve the water related issues. Key note address was

delivered by the chief guest, former Agriculture Minister, Nawab Muhammad Yusuf Talpur, and currently Member, Standing Committee of National Assembly on Water and Power.

2nd International Workshop on Applications of ICTs in Education, Healthcare and Agriculture:

The INIT convened this workshop at National Institute of Posts and Telecommunications Rabat, Kingdom of Morocco from November 23 - 25, 2015. The objectives of the workshop included strengthening the capability of software and applications developers, researchers and students involved in designing practical applications addressing development problems in the areas of education, healthcare and agriculture from the common member states of the partner organizations. It further aimed at developing an understanding as well as possibly helping to develop ICT applications and policies conducive for improving governance structures in the thematic areas of the Workshop. 35 resource persons/participants representing 21 institutions from 11 countries participated in the workshop. These countries included Egypt, Gambia, Guyana, Iran, Jordan, Morocco, Pakistan, Palestine, Senegal, Sudan, and Uganda. The same (3rd) was held in Amman, Jordan from May 31- June 1, 2016.

Workshop on ICTs for Development - Mainstreaming the Marginalized: The INIT in collaboration with the Ministry of Information Technology and Telecommunications, Government of Pakistan organized this 2 days workshop from January 12-13, 2016 in Islamabad. The workshop was inaugurated by the honorable Federal Minister for Science and Technology, Rana Tanveer Hussain. Professor Tim Unwin, UNESCO Chair ICT4D and Emeritus Professor at Royal Holloway, University of London was the principal resource person. The



workshop was aimed at highlighting the potential of ICTs in revolutionizing various sectors of the economy to aid the most marginalized. It aimed at conducting a uniquely interactive learning exercise that provided ample opportunities for participating subject specialists, scholars, consultants, academics

and entrepreneurs to voice their expert opinions regarding ICTs as a means to securing a brighter future for the most marginalized in society.

Pak-China Business Forum 2016: CIIT organized the 5th Pak-China Business Forum from March 19-22, 2016 to promote university-industry collaborations in business and economic sectors for the mutual benefit of both countries. Punjab Chief Minister, Muhammad Shahbaz Sharif, inaugurated the Forum at Expo Center Lahore. The Forum was the biggest Pak-China business forum to date with participation of over 700 delegates from 400 Chinese and 300 Pakistani companies. The forum consisted of stalls of Chinese companies in various sectors. It offered an opportunity for Pakistani businessmen to meet their Chinese counterparts. Punjab Board of Investment and Trade (PBIT) also actively participated in the forum by setting up a stall where the Board's experts briefed the visiting Chinese investors about investment opportunities in Punjab. The forum encompassed project exhibitions, seminars, workshops and industrial academic expo. It also helped in promoting thematic areas of Renewable Energy Technologies, New Energy Technologies, Information & Communication Technologies (ICT), Water Conservation, Purification & Sanitation, Biomedical Materials, in consultation with Chinese counterparts. The forum provided an opportunity for commercialization of products and processes of the participating organizations.

Regional Training Workshop on GIS for Agricultural

Monitoring: The INIT in joint collaboration with ISESCO and Pir Mehr Ali Shah University of Arid Agriculture convened the 03 days workshop from March 28-30, 2016 in Islamabad. It aimed at strengthening the scientific capacity of the member states in using GIS applied to agriculture sector. It provided an excellent opportunity for the participants to understand use of satellite imagery, remote sensing, and GIS applications as tool to assess the evolution of vegetation cover at various scales. Around 80 participants/resource persons from 14 institutions from Iran, Pakistan, Morocco, and Sudan participated in the workshop.

Seminar on State of the Economy and Federal Budget 2016-17: A full day pre-budget seminar was organized on May 03, 2016 by CPS. The objective of the seminar was to evaluate the state of the economy and suggest policy recommendations for the federal budget 2016-17 which would be helpful in setting policy direction to improve the performance of the economy. Around 125 participants from academia, civil society and government attended the seminar. The chief guest was Mr. Haroon Akhtar Khan, Special Advisor to Prime Minister on Revenue.

The United Institute of Informatics Problems (UIIP), NASB: A MoU was signed on December 10, 2015. The purpose of the MoU is to promote scientific cooperation in areas of mutual benefit.





CHAPTER 03

Quality Assurance

Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC)

CIIT Pakistan is committed to serve the nation with total institutional and customer's satisfaction high standard international higher educational academic and research pursuits in all its campuses, with leadership commitment to enhance the quality standardization and given top priority for making CIIT as shining star in world's horizon. For achieving this task all stakeholders like teachers, students and researchers contributed excellently by best of their abilities for meeting national and international quality standardization and assurance in all programs. Wherein QEC has is played a pivotal role.

By realizing the fact that quality as an integral component and excellence in higher education and research as a strategic imperative, CIIT manifested its progressive mission continuously by establishing the Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) in the year 2006, and since then, has taken bold initiatives to attain, manage and enhance quality at the institutional level in all cadres of the Institute's management, academic and administration. For making CIIT a quality-centric institution, the QEC has undertaken various quality assurances based assignments very successfully and achieved highest "W" category at national level from HEC in yearly Progress Report (YPR) from continuously from the last 03 years (2012 to 2015) and amicably cultivated the quality culture at all levels in CIIT system.

Impact of Quality Assurance in the University

Quality Assurance and Assessment Process (QAAP) of CIIT Academic Programs

The Quality Assurance and Assessment Process (QAAP) of all Academic Programs were undertaken being a continuous process across CIIT. The Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) is coordinating for the implementation and also monitors the Quality Assurance and Assessment Process (QAAP) across CIIT. QEC managed awareness/ training sessions and workshops and also conducted the systematic process of gathering, reviewing and using important quantitative and qualitative data and information from multiple and diverse sources about educational programs. The purpose of this exercise is to improve student learning, and evaluating mechanism of academic and learning standards. The process culminates when assessment results are used to ensure the improvement in student's quality learning.

The assessment process undertaken is to ensure the quality of all academic programs of CIIT and aligned these programs and activities with the strategic plan of the departments and Institute as per assessment criteria requirements of Quality Assurance Agency HEC.

QEC has completed SA process of 56 programs: 4 programs till 2008; 29 programs till 2011; 18 programs till 2013; 05 programs till 2014, during 2015 SARs of 54 more programs have been submitted to HEC. During 2016 the Self -

Assessment Process has been initiated for 116 programs at 8 campuses of CIIT. So far, 92 SARs of 08 campuses are prepared and are ready for the next stage of Assessment Process which is likely to be completed by the end of Spring

2017.

QEC also developed a Uniform Assessment Survey (UAS) Policy for implementation across CIIT system for course evaluation by the teachers / faculty and uploaded on faculty portal of CU-Online Portal and its results are incorporated in SARs.

QS International University Rankings (World and Asian)

CIIT has maintained its position in 201-250 range of top Asian Universities announced by QS Asian University Rankings in during the period from 2014-2016. CIIT is also positioned in

top 301-400 in Mathematics and 401-450 in Computer Science and Information Systems by QS World University Ranking by subject.

HEC National Rankings

QEC oriented itself to the improvement and implement of quality and in this endeavor, successfully helped in making QA procedures and practices a part of the university quality management system. To this effect, it performed the major task of completing/filling up of the HEC Ranking Proforma along with evidences and provided to Quality Assurance Agency HEC for the University Ranking 2015. The CIIT was ranked at No. 03 in General Universities Category and at No. 06 in overall category in Pakistan and placed in the list of top ten universities in Pakistan.

Nature Index

CIIT is placed at # 1 among top ten institutions of Pakistan on the basis of nature index.

Participation in Decision Making Through Statutory and Non-statutory Bodies

QEC being member has contributed in all meetings of the statutory and non statutory bodies and forums and provided significant input on the quality of academic programs, courses and scheme of studies, and contributed in preparation of new academic programs and overall processes and practices of quality assurance in CIIT system.

External Institution Performance Evaluation (IPE)

The QEC facilitated successfully another IPE of CIIT that was conducted in January 2016 in collaboration with Islamabad Campus.

ISO 9001-2008 QMS Certification

The QEC arranged two days training courses for the



Departmental ISO Coordinators/Implementers and ISO Internal Auditors in July-September 2015. The QEC amicably monitored and facilitated 1st External Annual Surveillance ISO audit in December 2015 for continuation of certification of all campuses was successfully completed and awarded by NQA-UKAS United Kingdom for the year 2016.

ISO 9001:2008 Workshop

For creating effective advanced awareness and needs to ensue raising campuses capabilities and commitment levels for achieving better quality options of Quality Assurance and Quality Management System as per international standards the QEC organized a workshop titled "Sharing the Best Practices for Implementation and Improvement of QMS of CIIT System" at Islamabad Campus wherein all Management Representatives (MRs) of CIIT campuses participated, deliberated and shared their best practices being undertaken on implementation of ISO 9001:2008 QMS in CIIT. It was realized that in CIIT system level of QMS and quality assurance adoption and implementation is now considerably high and campuses are giving top priority to such standardizations and ranking in top positions both at national and international pursuits. The commitment at leadership level is very high and is on top priority.

ISO Mate

ISO Mate (a software application to manage ISO related documents and other operations) was developed by Management Representative (MR) Office, CIIT Islamabad and launched in June 2016. It is a very unique product in its own nature and was exclusively designed by the MR Office to cater for needs of ISO documentation and automate other relevant operations such as carrying out ISO Internal



Audits, announcing of audit schedules, preparing and distribution of MRC (Management Review Committee) agenda and minutes etc. It also has its own built in e-mail and communication messaging service.

Currently, all documentation from CIIT Islamabad Campus and Principal Seat is being transferred to its database through ISO Mate. Also, the first Internal Audit of year 2016 was carried out successfully through this software. At present, its usage is limited to CIIT Islamabad and Principal Seat over Local Area Network. However, after sufficient testing and user satisfaction, it will be made available for other campuses within CIIT system and can be looked for commercial use.

Participation in International Events

QEC represented CIIT at international forum by participating in the following events:

- Ms Shazia Shabbir, Srenior Program Officer, QEC participated in the Erasmus Mundus Mobility with Asia (EMMA) Action I program in July 2015 and had worked with University of Heidelberg Germany for professional development. She studied the quality measures and procedures of Quality Management System being practiced and in place at the University of Heidelberg.
- Mr. Shahid Iqbal, Additional Registrar, QEC, participated in the 2nd QS Sumer School Summit jointly organized by the University of Malaysia and QS Asia from December 01-02, 2015 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. The summit was useful for professionals of higher education involved in international networking, innovation in higher education etc. It provided the knowledge about higher education business models,

- the latest trends and market intelligence.
- She was again invited by the EMMA through ECEA for the Action II program, the next stage of the mobility. The Université de Nice-Sophia Antipolis, France invited her for the next stage of mobility in June 2016. She studied about the interactive comparative approach and analyzed the Quality Assurance practices at CIIT Pakistan, Heidelberg University Germany and the Université de Nice-Sophia Antipolis and tried to explore the new avenues for research and productivity for the faculty and students of CIIT in different disciplines being offered by University of Heidelberg Germany and the Université de Nice-Sophia Antipolis, France.

Membership of Associations/Networks

CIIT acquired the membership of Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU) in 2015.

Accreditation of Academic Programs from Relevant Councils

The QEC team is supporting in accreditation process of all academic programs. The accreditation of programs is being done at the departmental level at CIIT. The departments get themselves accredited from their relevant accreditation bodies. The engineering programs are accredited by Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC), whereas Management Sciences programs are accredited by National Business Education Accreditation Council and Pharmacy programs by Pharmacy Council of Pakistan. The Computer Science programs are accredited by ABBET.









CHAPTER 04

Faculty Development

Investing in human resources, more precisely the faculty and staff, has been a flagship initiative of COMSATS Institute of Information Technology (CIIT). It is in this spirit that CIIT is running the largest faculty/staff development program in the country after HEC.

Human Resource Development

Investing in human resources, more precisely the faculty and staff, has been a flagship initiative at the CIIT. It is in this spirit that CIIT is currently running one of the largest faculty/staff development programs among the public and private sector universities in Pakistan.

During the preceding 15 years, CIIT has invested generously in human resource development through awarding MS and PhD level scholarships to its meritorious faculty/staff. During this time, over 360 fully funded scholarships have been awarded to the faculty/staff to pursue higher studies at some of the best universities in the world. Over 140 MS and over 100 PhD scholars have successfully completed studies on CIIT scholarship, returned back and are serving the Institution. Currently, about 82 scholars are pursuing studies on CIIT funding. These scholarships were awarded through merit-oriented albeit stringent criteria which was open to the deserving candidates both already serving and willing to serve CIIT upon award of scholarships and upon completion of studies.


Simultaneously, generous facilitation was provided to the faculty/staff in securing funding from alternate sources. The alternate sources were tapped through institutional arrangements agreed between the CIIT and other universities and those offered by other funding agencies. Over 500 intending scholars were, as well, generously granted leave for study purposes, etc. Currently, over 472 scholars are pursuing their studies on alternate sources of funding. Today, the CIIT proudly boasts of having excellent intellectual ensemble of over 1,000 PhDs in its faculty/staff

The choice of subjects of candidates placed abroad was aligned with the Institution's long term priorities and the scholars remained under a keen vigil of the management and senior academics for their performance. Getting quality education, exposure to cutting-edge research, prospects of strengthening linkages with universities abroad and the scholars taking up productive work immediately upon their return back were the guiding principles.

CIIT understands that as the quality of academic programs is becoming competitive, there is more compelling need for the faculty and management staff to improve their academic qualifications. The CIIT has afforded generous opportunities and facilitation to the faculty/staff in this regard during the preceding years.

It is also pertinent to mention here that the painstaking yet rewarding experience of investing in the able youth has particularly been rewarding through inculcating a research culture at CIIT which has helped it attain 1st position in research productivity among over 170 public and private universities/degree awarding institutions in Pakistan. This is heartwarming especially so because the CIIT has a life of just 16 years.

Faculty Development Academy

Faculty Development Academy (FDA) has been working on professional development of CIIT faculty as well as non-faculty of all of its eight campuses since October 2011. Over the past five years, FDA has launched diverse programs of trainings at different times of the year and for different levels, to enhance the knowledge and skills repertoire of its faculty/non-faculty members. Initiatives provide an enriched teaching and learning experience for the faculty, and also offer support in research, leadership and academic administrative processes. In an age where student learning is evolving and changing, it is imperative to strive to stay current with technological advances in teaching. Besides

the training of faculty, FDA also organizes programs and initiatives that assist staff members for developing skills and competencies as professionals in order to prepare them for institutional efficiency and effectiveness. A summary of its activities during the year 2015-16 is given below:

In-Service Trainings

During the reporting period, following in-service trainings were organized by FDA to broaden the skills set of the faculty:

05 Weeks Summer Camp for Nonfaculty Members of CIIT Lahore and Abbottabad: The summer camp was arranged at CIIT Islamabad from July 27 - August 28, 2015. Thirty seven professionals from different administrative departments constituted the target trainees. This was a residential workshop and all the participants were engaged in activities from 6 am to 10 pm. Special arrangements were made to groom them intellectually as well as physically through physical exercise in the morning before the start of the day. Eminent resource persons from CIIT as well as from other universities and renowned organizations were invited to deliver lectures and improve skills of the participants. In order to promote their self confidence and self esteem, they were taken to important academic places for interaction with influential personalities.



04 Weeks Graduate Record Examination (GRE)

Preparatory Workshop: FDA arranged this workshop from July 27-August 21, 2015 for the faculty members of CIIT. 23 participants attended the workshop. GRE test holds great significance as it is mandatory for obtaining admissions at prestigious international universities for higher studies. This workshop was designed to help those who were intending to pursue higher studies in world's leading universities. Mr. Qadeer Sethi and Mr. Adnan Hanif from National University of Science & Technology (NUST) were the distinguished resource persons. The workshop helped them brush up their skills, review materials for the verbal and quantitative sections of the exam, and conducted full length practice tests.



03 Days Workshop on Psychological Assessment:

The workshop was organized from August 16-19, 2015 in the Office of CIIT Project Management in Karachi. 16 faculty members from different universities of Karachi participated in the workshop. The objective was to check if FDA could conduct its training programs in Karachi especially in the field of Psychological Assessment. Some very eminent psychologists/ mental health professionals were invited as resource persons who shared their knowledge and skills with the participants.

02 Weeks Professional Development Workshop:

The workshop was organized by FDA for the faculty members of Baluchistan Universities in collaboration with Inter University Consortium for the Promotion of Social Sciences and Government of Baluchistan from August 24 - September 04, 2015. There were 22 participants from different universities of Baluchistan. The purpose of this training was to expose young faculty of Baluchistan Universities to emerging frontiers of knowledge and dynamic personality development. The training was sponsored by National Testing Services.

Indigenous on Campus Training (IoT): FDA was given a mandate by Higher Education Commission (HEC) to arrange a series of 07 Indigenous on Campus Training (IoT)

under Modern University Governance Program. Accordingly, FDA designed 7 different workshops for non-faculty members of its own campuses as well as for other universities. The guidelines of IoT were given by the HEC. Each IoT workshop was for three days with 9 sessions of 90 minutes each. A batch of 35 participants was arranged by FDA for each training. The seven IoT workshops conducted by FDA are briefly explained below:

A 03 days course on Office Procedures and Practices was conducted from October 06-08, 2015. The purpose of workshop was to equip the participants with standard procedures and practices demanded by the nature of the task at hand. There were 32 participants in all, the training proved beneficial in

terms of trainees' expansion of knowledge, office skills and development of multiple human capacities.

- The second workshop of the series was conducted on Human Resource Management from October 12-14, 2015. There were 30 participants in all, 21 from CIIT Campuses and 09 from different local universities/HEIs. The objectives of the workshop included expansion of the trainees' current knowledge, sharpening of their skills and facilitating their personal and professional growth to help them emerge as Master Trainers.
- The third module of the series was on Leadership Skills and Management Approaches from
- October 27-29, 2015, attended by 35 participants, equivalent to BS-16 and above from various institutions. The main objective was to equip the trainees with latest knowledge in related fields and sharpen their leadership skills deemed essential for both personal, interpersonal effectiveness and professional growth.
- Academic Planning and Management was the fourth module of the series which commenced from November 03-05, 2015. A group of 35 non-faculty members attended the course. The purpose of the workshop was to help the participants learn important academic and managerial skills.
- A 03 days course was on Planning and Development Dynamics, which was fifth of the sequence from November 10-12, 2015. There were 34 participants in all, 26 from CIIT Campuses and 08 from different local universities/HEIs. They were taught that planning is the process of determining how organizations can get where they want to go, and how they accomplish their objectives.
- Financial Management was the sixth 03 days course of the chain from November 17-19, 2015. A group of 35 non-faculty members were the audience. The objective was to sharpen the saw of the officers, improving their understanding, interpretation and usage of financial statement and management ratios.

The last module of the string was on Personality Development from December 01-03, 2015. There were 36 participants, 26 from CIIT Campuses and 08 from different local universities/HEIs. This module was highly appreciated.

3rd Strategic Development Workshop for HoDs:

As per past practice, FDA organized this workshop from January 19-21, 2016. Thirty four participants from Islamabad, Attock, Wah and Abbottabad Campuses attended the workshop. The workshop was arranged at Marriott Hotel, Islamabad. The purpose was to devise strategies to refresh commitment of HoDs, help them expand their knowledge which will be beneficial in growth and continual development of CIIT. The HoDs interacted with each other and shared their respective areas of strengths and weaknesses to improve in their respective departments.

Workshop on EU Funding-Window of

Opportunities: Realizing that funding is available from EU for research projects, FDA organized this workshop from January 26-28, 2016 to educate faculty/non-faculty about seeking international funding for further studies and research. There were 63 participants in all from all campuses of CIIT including Virtual Campus and one from PIMS Islamabad. The workshop provided detailed information about EU funding start-ups, consolidated grants, how to write proposals, how to develop linkages between academia and industry etc. The participants were encouraged to write research proposals for seeking EU funding.

Training for Primary Teachers of Pak-Turk Schools and Colleges: This in-service training was organized by FDA from March 29-30, 2016. The training

was arranged on request of Mr. Ahmet Kester, Director Education. Pak-Turk International Schools and Colleges. The purpose of this training was to transform the participants into effective teachers, reflective practitioners and dynamic role models for the young minds they are handling.

04 Days Workshop on Capacity Building: This workshop was organized for female officers of universities/HEIs from April 21-24, 2016 at CIIT Lahore. The audience comprised of 26 female officers in all, 15 from CIIT, 05 from University of Education, 04 from Govt. College University and 03 from Chandbagh School Foundation Muridke (Lahore). The

objective of the workshop was to

help participants build their individual competencies and explore further pathways for enhancement of personal growth and increased professional productivity. Prominent amongst the speakers were Mrs. Shama Aleem (Senior Executive VP, Chandbagh Foundation) and Muno Bhai who educated the female officers about the world around them through their delightful talks.

03 Days Workshop on Psychometric Testing and Application for HR Professionals: The workshop was arranged from May 10-12, 2016. Seventeen professionals from various universities/organizations including CIIT (Islamabad, Lahore and Abbottabad) attended the workshop. The objective was to equip the participants with tools and techniques that HR professionals generally require for the assessment of human resource. Different techniques were taught to the participants to help them differentiate between qualitative and quantitative measurement, applications of tests and their benefits.

02 Days Workshop on Literacy through Mobile

Phone: A humble effort was made by FDA to teach the staff grade employees about the features of smart phones in this workshop from May 13-14, 2016. It was a group of 24 persons from Services Department of CIIT Islamabad and FDA office. The workshop was successful in imparting the knowledge about how to install Urdu keyboard through the setting of their mobile phones, proper usage of keyboard to write alphabet, texting/messaging in Urdu language, break-ups of whole words into alphabets, internet connectivity (Wi-Fi) on a mobile device and how to connect to cellular data, use of calculator in their cellular device with basic signs and functions etc.

Pre-Service Trainings

FDA organized the following pre-service training for the new inductions during the reporting period:



7th Pre-Service Training Course, July 27-August 28, 2016: A parallel training was organized by FDA for young faculty members of all seven campuses of CIIT at

CIIT Abbottabad to make the best of better climate in Abbottabad. The objective of this training was to keep pace with modern and pedagogical requirements for the new entrant teachers. In total, there were 44 participants, out of whom 07 were females. Eminent resource persons were invited from within the city and also from Rawalpindi and Islamabad to deliver lectures. The closing ceremony was held on August 28, 2015. Dr. S. M. Junaid Zaidi, Rector CIIT, graced the ceremony as chief guest and awarded the certificates.




CHAPTER 05 Access

Student Enrollment







percentage of male, female students at Islamabad campus is 64% and 36%, and at Abbottabad and Lahore is 81% and 19%.




Representation of CIIT Alumni in Different Sectors

CHAPTER 06

Universities Building Economies

University Industry Linkages

Creating an interface between academia and industry is the most important tool in transferring the knowledge and providing students with the exposure of practical world. University-industry linkages are central in providing students with the opportunities to gain experience, work on real world problems and in return the pool of skilled and learned candidates increases for the industry. The efforts by various departments/campuses of CIIT in this regard during the reporting period are given below:

Industrial Liaison Cell (ILC) Student Chapter:

Department of Computer Science, CIIT Islamabad launched its ILC in March 2015. It was formed to act as a direct interface between the software industry and the department to ensure the professional development of our students. Moving further, Student chapter of ILC was established on November 03, 2015 to involve student representatives in the activities arranged by ILC. This was to ensure that the students also get a chance of direct interaction with the industry and take ownership of the activities, ensuring maximum student participation. The event was sponsored by Stallion Studios which is a startup by a recent alumnus.

1st Roundtable Discussion on Academia-Industry Collaboration: Department of Architecture, CIIT Islamabad organized this discussion in November 2015. The role of employers, jurors and teachers in grooming better architects and focus/objectives of a successful B. Arch thesis were also a part of discussion. Later on, a Design Program Roundtable was held on December 10, 2015 where the competent faculty held discussions and ideas sharing with potential employers, advisors, jurors and competitor

schools. This was the first ever such interaction with the industry.

Institute of Bankers, Pakistan: A meeting was held with Institute of Bankers, Pakistan on December 03, 2015. The agenda was to discuss possible future collaboration with CIIT and IBP, Pakistan in various disciplines. A draft MOU was discussed and communicated with both bodies for further discussion and implementation.

National Institute of Oceanography: Earth and Atmospheric Remote Sensing Research Group at the Department of Meteorology, CIIT Islamabad is helping National Institute of Oceanography in investigating the causes of Sea Water Intrusion in Indus Delta.

Collaboration with National Institute of Electronics (NIE): Collaboration between the Department of Electrical Engineering, CIIT Islamabad and NIE took place on April 29, 2016 and is currently underway in which 04 of final year projects were jointly supervised by the experts from NIE and faculty members of CIIT. Those projects were successfully completed and currently both the parties are interested in converting those projects into a commercialized product. Students from the Department of Electrical Engineering, CIIT Islamabad presented their work to the Director General of the NIE. The projects were supervised by Dr. Naveed ur Rehman, Assistant Professor, Department of Electrical Engineering, CIIT Islamabad. Various workshops are also conducted by NIE for CIIT under this collaboration.

NSR Technologies: A Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) was signed between NSR Energies (Pvt.) Ltd. and CIIT Lahore on May 16, 2016 to establish cooperation for research and development of indigenous energy resources

of Pakistan, efficient use of these resources, conservation and optimal use of energy, safety, environment, and efforts to address energy related challenges in government, business and other organizations.

Business/Technology Incubation Center

The Business Incubation Center (BIC) aims at commercialization of CIIT research and development. This is to be achieved through rapid and sustainable development of economy by deploying knowledge inputs to the society. The vision relies on education and technology inputs especially which are available/ developed at CIIT to industry, agriculture, health to contribute towards improvement of socio-economic structure of Pakistan.

During the reporting period, BIC conducted the following activities:

Pre Startup Program at BIC - Idea to Startup Labs (i2s Labs)

Pre-startup is an essential phase for any start-up. Entrepreneurs who are in the exploration stage of their business ideas, or even entrepreneurs with ready products but have yet to validate their ideas benefit from going through pre-startup program. The main objective of the pre-startup program is to support entrepreneurs in transforming their ideas into startup companies with marketable finished products and smart business plan.

Pre-Startup Teams Working in BIC i2s Labs

The following teams are working in i2s labs from January-July, 2016 and approximately 36 members are incubated in BIC i2s Labs 2nd startup batch:

1.Learn and Earn

Learn and Earn is an education based startup which is helping the students and teacher to connect and learn in a unique way. Learn and Earn is a new concept in e-education system where teacher can teach students online and get paid per lecture. Its model is similar to other freelancing platforms where you get paid after completing your project from clients. The only difference in this platform is that it is only dedicated to teaching.

2. Ferro Entertainment

Ferro Entertainment an Indie mobile game studio, currently focusing on casual and arcade mobile games for all age groups. They are currently focusing on developing 2D and 3D Games for iOS and Android. Their target countries include US, UK, China, Australia, France, Germany, Russia, Canada, Japan, and South Korea.

3. Business Plus

Business Plus will provide one-stop place where people can plan their event according to their wishes in Islamabad and businessmen can claim and manage their own business page. Moreover, event managers will also be able to use their website to help people in making packages according to their budget.

4. Biology Decoded

Biology Decoded aims to circulate a bi-annual Biology magazine for students and faculty of Pakistan, India and Middle East. It will come out twice a year to keep up with the fast moving scientific advancements. It will be divided into 05 sections each addressing a different topic. To invoke the interest of students, it also contains a Fun Section which will have science related comics, crosswords and fun

5.Metamorph

Metamorph is an Interactive Studies for Kids, in which animations, games, and e-books are being developed for the kids of playgroup schools. This product is for kids of preschools and play groups in which they will start learning with interactive methods, colors and animations enabling easy learning.

6.Outpost 300

Outpost 300 is a modular environment monitoring system that prevents disastrous situations resulting from climate and power related issues within mission-critical environments. This system gives actionable alerts in realtime reducing revenue loss, guarding reputations and preventing system downtime, damage and data loss. They help customers develop end-to-end real-time data acquisition, monitoring, control and automation solutions using various software, hardware and third-party packages.

7. Processing Inc

Processing Inc. builds educational software to simplify the life of institution administrators and teachers so that they can focus on the most important thing i.e. educating our children. They are bridging the digital divide in education by offering the services at affordable pricing.

8.ToggleTechs

Believing in the phrase that "Every market is for us", toggleTechs provides customized software, mobile phone applications, desktop applications, websites and business solutions for businesses. Telebudgie Pvt. Ltd. visited CIIT Abbottabad on December 29, 2015 for an Internship Seminar. The purpose of the seminar was to give students of Department of Computer Science and Management sciences, a presentation and brief about what they are doing and what they are expecting from the students in terms of internship. Mr. Zamir Awan, CEO gave a brief introduction of the company. Mr. M. Dawood presented the software features and Mr. Usman Khan concluded with Internship requirements from software developers and sales and marketing internees.

Department of Computer Science, CIIT Abbottabad organized a seminar on Career Development in Software Engineering on November 19, 2015. The director of a well reputed IT company SNSKIES, Mr. Mohammad Ismail informed students about current job trends and registered selected students for internship.

A Career Development Center was established at CIIT Wah on April 25, 2016. The objectives of center are to guide students to develop their academic career interests in line with their short or long terms goals, help them prepare for interview and develop their communication skills, make appropriate and realistic career choices and career direction, manage and give information regarding scholarships, and look for the range of career profiles for students.

Walk-in interviews by HBL and UBL was arranged for the graduates of Department of Management Sciences, CIIT Sahiwal, on October 16, 2015. The representatives of UBL and recruiter company of HBL interviewed the fresh graduating students. More than 40 candidates appeared in interviews.

Besides, career development cells at all other campuses provide proper guidance to the students regarding their internships and career as well. Students are directed to various organizations (like banks, public, private sector etc.) for internship so that their professional skills are polished. Various organizations are contacted by the campuses itself to depute the students and regular feedback is asked from the head of the organizations so that the performance of the students is assessed for further improvement.

Student Counseling and Career Guidance

Career Counseling plays a major role in student career, life and it cannot be taken in a lighthearted manner. Many people get stuck with a job which they feel they are not supposed to be at but perform exceptionally well. There are some other who despite being in a great job, fail to live up to the expectations as they are burdened with job responsibilities. This session held on December 30, 2015 covered all such issues. Syed Azhar Husnani Abidi, Chief Executive, PICC was the resource person.

CIIT Islamabad organized a career expo in collaboration with CIMA on May 18, 2016. The target of this expo was to provide opportunities to students pursuing their degrees in finance and accounting. Top accounting and finance companies participated in it.

Department of Computer Science, CIIT Islamabad arranged a two days activity from July 27-28, 2015 in collaboration with U-fone (a leading telecom operator in the country) to carry out mock interview sessions. The experts guided the users on how to present themselves and answer effectively in a real interview session. The department also invited Dr. Mustansar Tanauli on October 20, 2015 to share his experiences with the students to motivate them and suggest possible career choices in the field of computing. Dr. Tanauli is an entrepreneur and CEO of Fori Mazdoori, an initiative to use ICT for the uplift of the laborers in South-East Asia.

Office of Development, CIIT Abbottabad organized a series of seminars on career counseling on November 11, 2015 for the students on the following topics:

- ▲ CV Writing and Interviewing Skills
- Investor Education Seminar
- Stress/Conflict Management and Job Searching

Department of Management Sciences, CIIT Wah arranged two days workshop on career counseling for students from November 13-14, 2015. Experts from industry and intellectuals from different Institutes were invited to deliver lectures. Another workshop titled Stepping in Career was also arranged on January 01, 2016 and May 25, 2016. Workshop aimed to familiarize students with professional approach they need to adopt while applying for a job and appearing in interviews. It focused on job hunting, personal grooming, and preparation of cover letter and resume.

02 days Talent Grooming and Career Counseling Workshop was arranged at CIIT Sahiwal from May 18-19, 2016. More than 160 students from Departments of Management Sciences, Computer Science, Biosciences, Mathematics, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering were registered. It was arranged in two batches with 80 students each on both days and each batch comprised of four sessions.







Development Projects

CHAPTER 7

The Public Sector Development Program (PSDP) is the main instrument for providing budgetary resources for the development projects and programs of CIIT. Until the end of financial year viz FY 2015-16, CIIT has successfully

completed 48 projects (Annexure B) having capital cost of Rs. 8770.474 million.

For the FY 2015-16 the Government of Pakistan allocated Rs. 165 million for two (02) development projects of CIIT. During the said period, Rs. 150 million have been released.

CHAPTER 8

Strengthening Technological Infrastructure

Digital Library

The Library and Information Services at CIIT aim to support the teaching and academic work by assisting and providing, information, books, periodicals, research journals, newspapers, audio visual, and research information materials to the students, faculty and staff. In today's electronic and technological era, the significance of a digital library cannot be undermined.

CIIT Library is providing access to more than 33,000 high quality, peer-reviewed journals, databases, and articles through HEC's Digital Library program. In addition to this, thousands of e-books are also offered on different subject areas like Science and Technology, Social Sciences and Humanities. Students and faculty can access these resources from within and outside the campus through IP address and Virtual Private Network (VPN) respectively.

E-Library

CIIT Islamabad library has also developed its own e-Books Library. The library is being updated continuously by downloading e-books on various subjects from different free/subscribed databases. The total number of e-books currently available is around 10,000. The CIIT e-library can be accessed through http://ww3.comsats.edu.pk/library/ciit_elibrary

Besides, 80,000 online books are also available through the Digital Library Program of HEC. The e-books support program allowed researchers to access most of the important text and reference books electronically in a variety of subject areas.

Other digital/electronic services provided by CIIT

Islamabad library include Free Online Public Access Journals, Electronic Document Delivery Services, Video Conferencing Room, Computer Workstations with a seating area for about 1000 users with 300 computers on various floors of the library, Wi-Fi, Innovative/Hi-Tech, RFID Management System, etc.

Pakistan Education and Research Network (PERN)

The PERN connects universities and research institutes through high-speed internet bandwidth. The main purpose of this network is to facilitate researchers/students in sharing data and to coordinate with each other though video conferencing.

Due to the increasing number of IT users, the IT infrastructure at CIIT Islamabad has been enhanced and in this regard during 2015-2016, PERN bandwidth has been increased up to 400Mbps.

CIIT Wah is associated with HEC under PERN2 and is availing internet facility of 22Mbps bandwidth.

CIIT Lahore also took the internet services from PERN under the bandwidth of 500 Mbps per month.

All other campuses except CIIT Vehari are availing PERN facility.

Video Conferencing Facilities

Video conferencing has enabled all users to connect, communicate, conference, and share information in any environment. At CIIT, video conferencing is currently utilized for distance learning program (Virtual Campus),



and to conduct meetings for efficient and effective use of its time and resources.

Video conferencing facility is available at all CIIT campuses with varying seating capacity.

Campus Management Solution (CMS)

CIIT approved IT policy in 2014 to stream line it services and processes in all campuses of the organization. During the reporting period, following activities were carried out in this regard:

Development of New Portal//Apps for Faculty: A new feature rich faculty portal is developed for CIIT faculty

which offers various new features. The portal is first major component of new CMS being introduced in all CIIT campuses. Few important features of said portal are:

- ▲ Easy navigation and data entry
- ▲ Import and export of frequently used data
- ▲ New security model
- ▲ Added features for HoDs
- ▲ More departmental control for HoDs
- ▲ Designed to extend/integrate with other systems
- IPhone and Android apps fully integrated with faculty portal
- Class management features
- ▲ Enhanced security layers
- Object based learning module (OBE)

Development of New HR and Payroll Management System: CUOnline did analysis of HR system needs on

unique environment of CIIT with its distributed campuses. Active development of new HR system has been initiated. It is also working to introduce new payroll management system to resolve several issues in existing systems at various campuses.

CIIT Information App for Smart Phones: CUOnline launched an app for smart phones for prospective students, parents and general public. App lists Programs, departments, important contacts, transport routes, library and other information needed by end users in easy navigation. App was designed during February-June 2016, to deliver relevant data to all CIIT campuses.

Deployment of CMS at MirPur University of Science and Technology (MUST) AJK: A contract was secured with MUST last year to automate its academic process. CUOnline achieved great success in deploying CMS customized as per MUST needs and conducted online admissions for the university as per their rules and regulations successfully during the reporting period. Deployment of academics, examinations, faculty, students and library modules was also completed successfully.

Deployment of CMS at Ghulam Ishaq Khan Institute

(GIK): A contract was secured with MUST last year to automate its academic process. CUOnline successfully transferred legacy data of GIK systems to newly deployed CMS. CMS is customized as per GIK needs and conducted online admissions for the university as per their rules and regulations successfully during the reporting period. Student fee management system is also successfully deployed at GIK. Deployment of academics, examinations, faculty, students and library modules are underway as planned and will be followed by HR and accounts.

Online Admission System

A robust Admissions System which offers various new features including online integration support to several other systems is fully operational at CIIT. The campus-wise breakdown of the submitted applications through Online Admission System during the reporting period is tabulated below:

CHAPTER 9

Universities

Today, university-community interaction is imperative for knowledge transfer and to build a community with opportunities of learning for students. Keeping in mind the importance of community building and increasing significance of university-community interaction, CIIT carried out following activities during the reporting period:

Department of Humanities, CIIT Islamabad organized an Anti-Smoking Campaign on December 29, 2015. The purpose of this campaign was to aware the youth/students about the harmful effects of smoking and to encourage them to curtail the habit. Another seminar was arranged by the department on Violence against Women on December 09, 2015. It is one of the severe issues prevailing in the society and it is pertinent to aware the students/youth about it and sensitize them to its gravity. The seminar was arranged for this purpose.

The department also conducted an Anti-Littering Campaign on November 27, 2015. The purpose of the campaign was to highlight the importance of clean environment and disposing off the trash properly.

CDC, CIIT Islamabad organized a seminar on Corruption and Role of Youth on December 10, 2015 in collaboration with Transparency International Pakistan. Also a walk was arranged on same day to create awareness regarding this issue.

Department of Architecture, CIIT Islamabad organized an art exhibition, showcasing paintings and greeting cards created by students of SOS Village Islamabad, during a

workshop on painting arranged for them by CIIT on May 17, 2016. The exhibition consisting of 54 fabulous paintings and over 150 greeting cards was inaugurated by Mr. Salman Farooqi, the Federal Ombudsman at the CIIT Art Gallery. Around 20 SOS Village Islamabad students, aged between 14 and 17 years enrolled in Matric, who had demonstrated the potential to learn the art of painting, were chosen by their school to participate in the one-week workshop on art, organized by the Department from May 02-06, 2016. IEEE-CIIT and IEEE WIE-CIIT conducted the series of activities including the basic knowledge of computer, online activities and quiz competition for the students of "The Education Zone" which is being run by charitable organization. IEEE-CIIT also took part in the inauguration ceremony of the Activity Room of the school and distributed gifts among the kids of school. The event was held on December 19, 2015.

CIIT Abbottabad organized a seminar on Cancer Awareness on December 03, 2015. Dr. Syed Jawad Akhtar Hussain, Director Institute of Nuclear Medicine Oncology and Radiotherapy (INOR), Dr. Syeda Tatheer Fatima, SMO INOR, and Deputy Director were the resource persons. They talked about common myths about Breast Cancer and Breast Cancer Screening.

Department of Electrical Engineering, CIIT Abbottabad organized a Cleanliness Walk on December 31, 2015. Dr. Shahid Khattak, Chairman Department of Electrical Engineering, Dr. Abdur Rashid, Head of Department, faculty members and students of the department participated in the walk. The purpose of the walk was to create awareness among the students about a clean, pollution free environment.

A workshop on awareness of Thalassemia was arranged by

DAWAA Society, Department of Pharmacy, CIIT Abbottabad in collaboration with Jamila Sultana Foundation from October 17-18, 2015. The speakers gave a brief lecture on thalassemia and how it can be cured. The aim was to develop a strong sense of blood donation advantages and to donate to the right and needy thalasseamic children. The faculty and students donated blood and a total of 269 blood bags were collected.

5th UMRAH Funds Draws Ceremony was held on September 11, 2015 at CIIT Abbottabad. This is a regular



scheme which provides deserving employees with opportunities to perform this religious ritual. 28 employees of CIIT Abbottabad were selected.

Eid Gifts Distribution Ceremonies for Pakistan Sweet Home children were held at CIIT Abbottabad on July 10 and September 22, 2015. Director CIIT Abbottabad Prof. Dr. Khan Gul Jadoon distributed the gifts among the students. These students are being looked after by CIIT Abbottabad since 2011. Under the said program, CIIT Abbottabad is hosting 100 orphan children aged 4-6 years. A separate place has been provided for housing these children. They have been assigned to a quality educational institution.

CIIT Abbottabad is regularly engaging schools and colleges of Abbottabad, Haripur and Mansehra for counseling sessions, visits, and activities of extracurricular and co-curricular in nature. This in return benefits the students of the region. A few of the activities conducted under this umbrella during the months of February-April 2016 are as follows:

- Lectures in Various Colleges by the Faculty of CIIT Abbottabad
- Ms. Bushra Ismail, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry delivered a lecture on Career Paths and Future Prospects in Modernage Boys Public School and College, Abbottabad on February 20, 2016
- Dr Yasir Javed, Assistant Professor, Department of Management Sciences briefed 75 students of on Career Counseling in Igra Acadmy Abbottabad on February 19, 2016
- Dr Shahid Khattak, Professor, Department of Electrical

Engineering conducted a presentation on Augmented Humans in Pakistan International Public School and College, Abbottabad on February 19, 2016. He delivered the same on Cadet College Batrasi on February 29, 2016

Dr Abdul Sami Awan, Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics visited Mansehra Public School and Girls College on February 23, 2016 delivered a talk on Career paths. About 100 female students attended the session. Dr. Abdul Sami briefed about the general career counseling and how to plan their career in line with the demands of the century.

> CIIT Abbottabad established a Computer Lab at Govt. Model Primary School, Dhamtore. The inauguration of the computer lab took place at the Govt. School by Ms. Ammara Khattak, Deputy Commissioner Abbottabad on March 7, 2016. The lab consists of six functional computer systems and sound system, complete with the resources required for the students from class one to five.

> CIIT Wah Blood Donation Society arranged a Blood Donation Camp with association of Pakistan Red Crescent Society (PRCS) on May 5, 2016 which is a regular biannual activity. The

objective of this campaign is to raise awareness about the importance of blood donation in order to reduce the deficiency of blood supply at the National Blood Center. Through this campaign, on average 180 bags of blood are donated by the students and staff every year.

CIIT Lahore arranged a Thalassemia Awareness Seminar and Blood Camp on April 04, 2016 to spread awareness regarding a widespread genetic blood disorder in Pakistani society.



Department of Management Sciences, CIIT Lahore organized a tree plantation campaign on May 26, 2016. The purpose of this campaign was to contribute to clean environment, purifying polluted atmosphere and make a green pocket in the campus premises for all. In this activity, they donated one plant to the HOD of each department by

planting total 10 trees all around the campus.

CIIT Sahiwal and DRDF - USAID signed a MoU for the development of dairy sector in Punjab on September 10, 2015. The purpose of MoU is to collaborate in trainings of Master Trainers and staff to achieve the ultimate goal of developing the dairy and livestock sector in Punjab.

CIIT Vehari organized a seminar for awareness of traffic rules during the reporting period and more than 200 drivers from Punjab police and CIIT Vehari participated. District Coordination Officer of Vehari also attended the


Alumni Affairs and Achievements

CHAPTER 10 SPORTS

Sports are an important aspect of academic life and it complements the education. They help in increasing the depth of personality development of students and help them equip with traits like decision making and leadership ability, cooperation, team work, time management, etc.

CIIT organizes the Students' Week in every semester to cater the sports need of students. The detail of such activities during the reporting period is as follows:

Inter-departmental Sports

There are 18 departments at CIIT and students from each department actively participate in inter-departmental sports events to score and claim the trophy for their department. A week long slot is allocated in the schedule of every semester for students' week. The week offers students a short pause to recover from hectic and exhausting academic activities. Students participate in various co-curricular activities where they get ample opportunities to bring out their covert natural abilities. Students' week also provides youth at the CIIT with the prospects of working in collaboration, exercising leadership potential, taking initiatives and improving their social and behavioral skills.

In the same spirit, Students' Weeks were organized in Fall 2015 (November 01-07, 2015) and Spring 2016 (March 19-27, 2016) at CIIT Islamabad as a continuing tradition. Inter-departmental competitions were organized for the sports like Badminton, Basketball, Chess, Cricket, Table Tennis, Volleyball, Tug of War.

Department of Computer Science was declared the winner in Fall 2015 by securing 175 points, while Department of Management Sciences remained runner up with 165 points. Financial Year at a Glance

As CIIT has consolidated its infrastructure and has expanded its Campuses, capital is invested in land and equipment, etc. The noncurrent assets have increased by 8.7% and amount to Rs. 4,535,785,311.

Audit Report

Audit of the Accounts of CIIT up to June 30, 2015 by the Government and statutory audit has been completed. The audit for the year 2015-16 is in process.

Development Budget

The Public Sector Development Program (PSDP) is the main instrument for providing budgetary resources for the development projects and programs for all seven campuses of CIIT. Until the end of financial year 2015-16, CIIT has successfully completed 48 projects having capital cost of Rs. 8770.474 million.

For the financial year 2015-16, the Government of Pakistan allocated Rs. 165 million for two (02) development projects of CIIT. During the said period, Rs. 150 million have been released.

Self-generated Income

The main source of self-generated income for CIIT is the fees charged from the students. During the reporting period, the self-generated income was Rs. 4,535.282 million.

Student Spending Trend

During the reporting period, per student spending was Rs. 0.1800 million.

CHAPTER 13

University Governance

Board of Governors

In Pakistan there are typically two types of educational institutions in the public sector; in the first group a bicameral governing structure in the shape of Senate and Syndicate is in place while in other group, uni-cameral system is prevalent with either a Syndicate or a Board of Governors (BoG). CIIT falls in the second category having only the Board of Governors.

BoG supervises and controls administrative, academic, and financial affairs, and lays down policies of the Institute. The meeting of BoG is held biannually, and is chaired by Executive Director, Commission on Science and Technology for Sustainable Development in the South (COMSATS). The members of BoG include:

- 1.The Executive Director, COMSATS, who shall be the Chairman of the Board;
- 2.The Rector:
- 3. The Secretary, Ministry of Science and Technology,

Government of Pakistan or his nominee;

- 4.The Secretary, Ministry of Education, Trainings and Standards in Higher Education, Government of Pakistan or his nominee;
- 5.The Chairman, Higher Education Commission or his nominee;
- 6.One person to be nominated by the Educational NGOs:
- 7. The Directors of the campuses of the Institute;
- 8.Two deans to be nominated by the Managing Committee of COMSATS;
- 9. Three persons of outstanding merit to be nominated by the Managing Committee of COMSATS; and
- 10.The Registrar of the Institute, who shall be the

Academic Council

The Academic Council is the highest academic body of the Institute and lays down proper standards of instructions, research and examinations, regulates and promotes the academic life of the Institute. The Academic Council is chaired by the Rector while the members included are Directors of the respective campuses, Chairmen of the teaching departments, all Professors of the Institute, Registrar (Secretary), and five eminent scholars to be nominated by the BoG. According to the CIIT charter, the major functions of the council include:

- To propose to the BoG schemes for the constitution and organization of Faculties, Departments, Campuses, and BoS

Board of Advanced Studies and Research (BASAR)

The purpose of BASAR is to advise authorities on all the matters concerned with the promotion of advanced studies and research in the Institute, to appoint supervisors for research studies, to propose regulations for the ward of research degrees, etc. The BASAR consists of:

- Three Professors other than Deans to be appointed by the BoG

Uniform Management System (UMS)

UMS is a system which standardizes all the aspects of an organization/institute. An institutional setup of UMS for quality teaching and research productivity needs to be developed by planning and monitoring, feedback, and control. UMS has been functional at CIIT since last year and focuses on the above mentioned facets. In order to carry out planning and monitoring, three academic regulatory committees namely Campus Management Committee (CMC), Campus Academic Regulatory Committee (CARC), and Departmental Academic Regulatory Committee (DARC) were constituted on January 24, 2012. They plan strategies and formulate procedures for improving the quality of education in the Campus, and for improving the quality of education in the department respectively. CUOnline (web-based software) is used to gather feedback by generating various monitoring reports whereas control is done by CARC at campus level and by DARC at department level.

CARC: CARC works to ensure the uniformity, consistency, harmony and maximum utilization of campus resources to meet the standards prescribed under the UMS. The committee comprises of different members who are both from academic and administration facets and works on campus level. It must have at least seven sessions per given semester to formulate, ensure systematize and timely flow of information, and procedures compliance. It is also responsible to place a check to ensure quality education, and all the departments of the campuses are required to meet the standards as mentioned. It ensures the harmony and cooperation among the departments of the same campuses.

DARC: DARC entertains all the matters related to department and its prime objective is to create harmony among all the departments of campus by implementing policies and procedures approved by the legalized and authoritative forums. DARC comprises of three senior members of the department. This committee is solely authorized to ensure and take necessary measures to make a department improve education system using qualitative as well as quantitative measures. The committee meets all the faculty of the department at least twice per semester. All disputed/unsolved matters are referred to CARC. Introducing the new disciplines among courses is one of the important functions of DARC. It is responsible to ensure efficient grading and marking of papers, assignments, quizzes, and sessionals by the faculty during a semester

Individual Semester Plan Proforma (ISPP):

ISPP is a tool to analyze and evaluate the academic and research work of all PhD faculty members. Three reports are generated on the basis of data given by each department i.e. ISPPs report, discrepancy report, and minimum and maximum workload report of PhDs. It helps in having a clear view of work done by the PhDs in previous and current semester. The main purpose of this proforma is to know the efforts through the students supervised and published articles. It also describes the classes load, linkages with international universities, and individuals and other administrative responsibilities undertaken by PhD faculty, if any.

The detail of CARC and DARC meetings held during the reporting period is provided in the Annexure D.



CHAPTER 14

Office of Development

Office of Development (OoD) at CIIT was established and is functional since 2009. The activities of OoD during the reporting period are stated below:

Initiatives and implementation

Students Financial Aid Office (SFAO): Student Financial Aid offices at all CIIT campuses are fully functional and operating their duties with aim to facilitate deserving and meritorious students. All the campuses are having dedicated officers and staff members for the task pertaining to scholarships and student Financial Aid. Student queries are entertained on the basis of one window operation. These offices processed the data of more than 10 thousand applicants for scholarships during the reporting period.

Launch of New Scholarships: Multiple new scholarship schemes at CIIT campuses were launched during the reporting period to provide financial assistance to deserving students. Scholarships initiated in Fall 2015 and Spring 2016 semesters included Minorities Student Scholarships, Scholarships for top 10 Board position holders in Sahiwal campus, Special Scholarships for students admitted in programs such as BS (Bioinformatics), MSc. Mathematics and MCS in Sahiwal campus, and National Bank Qarz-e-Hasna scheme. More than thousand applications were processed to recommend deserving students for award of scholarships during the period.

•Continuation of Existing Scholarships: Along with the newly launched scholarships, Registrar Office worked on previously running scholarship and Financial Aid Schemes such as HEC Need Based scholarships, French Need Based scholarships, German Need Based scholarship, Workers Welfare Board scholarships, Pak-USAID Merit and Needs Based Scholarship, ICT R&D scholarships, NTS

Needs Based Scholarship, Afghan Students Scholarship, Punjab Educational Endowment Fund (PEEF) Scholarship, Meezan Bank Qarz e Hasna schemes, scholarships for children of industrial workers at Lahore, fee waiver scheme for children of Pak Army at CIIT Abbottabad, and fee waiver for wards of employees of POF Wah Cantt. 19,165 students were awarded scholarship these various scholarships during the reporting period disbursing total amount of Rs. 1,025,742,314.

Counseling and Training Sessions organized by SFAO for Students: Apart from provision of scholarships, other activities are also performed by SFAO to engage students in personality and character building activities that would help them in future. In this connection few of the activities are listed down:

Abbottabad Campus:

△ Office of Development organized a seminar consisting of various sessions on career counseling on November 11, 2015. The topics covered were CV Writing and Interviewing Skills, Investor Education, Stress/Conflict Management, and Job Searching. Scholarship recipients and graduating students were the target audience of the seminars.

Lahore Campus:

- Security and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP) conducted training session for students on Investor Education in November 2015 at CIIT Lahore.
- M/s Amal Academy offered a training session to students of CIIT Lahore on employability skills in January 2016. Amal Academy (amalacademy.org) is an education startup launched by a team of acumen Fund and Stanford MBA Alumni.
- Student grooming session was organized by SFAO in collaboration with M/s Warid Training and development division in February 2016. The objective

of the session was to bridge the gap between employer needs and student skill set. It aimed to equip students with interviewing skills, corporate ethics, grooming skills for employability etc.

M/s Rabtt Fellowship Program 2016 - Information session was conducted to get the students registered for teaching at low level school children during summer.

Sahiwal Campus

The Higher Education Commission conducted Talent Grooming and Career Counseling Workshop under "Pak-USAID Merit and Needs-Based Scholarship Program" at CIIT Sahiwal from March 29-30, 2016. 46 scholars, including eighteen females, studying under the scholarship attended the session. The said training workshop was funded by the USAID. The participants were trained and counseled by well renowned resource persons/trainers about communication skills, inter/intrapersonal skills, presentation skills, interactive group discussion, best solutions to make research projects easy for students as the part of their projects, compilation of research report, acquiring excellence in etc.



2-Days Talent Grooming and Career Counseling Workshop was organized at CIIT Sahiwal from May 18-19, 2016. The said training workshop was funded by the Office of Development, CIIT, Principal Seat, Islamabad. More than 160 students from Department of Management Sciences, Computer Science, Biosciences, Mathematics, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering participated in the workshop.

Trainings and Workshops to Staff of Student Financial Aid Offices

- ▲ HEC sponsored Indigenous on Campus Training under University Governance Program was held in series of training workshops. Staff members from Scholarship Unit Registrar Office participated in series of trainings held in different batches; 1st session on Office Procedures and Practices was held from October 06-08, 2015, second session on Personality Development was held from December 01-03, 2015 and third session was held from November 17-19, 2015.
- Training workshop on the Scholarship program titled USAID-funded Merit and Needs-Based Scholarship Program was held in HEC Islamabad. 03 CIIT officers and staff members attended the training workshop. It was 03 day comprehensive training session organized for all the partner universities of the scholarship program. The session was held from January 19-21, 2016
- Entrepreneurial Skills Development workshop 2016 by PEEF trainers was held at Murree from February 16-

18, **2016**. Staff members of SFAO CIIT Lahore attended the training workshop.

Besides, SFAO at CIIT Abbottabad, Lahore and Sahiwal were also engaged in following activities during the reporting period:

- SFAO CIIT Lahore attended PEEF event celebrating success on reaching 100,000 scholarships on October 02, 2015. Chief Minister Punjab and provincial and federal ministers, HEC chairman along with VC's of Punjab University, Women University, Education University, and other dignitaries form education fraternity were in attendance. Networking opportunity was utilized by sharing a word about CIIT and scholarship programs running at CIIT.
- Cheque distribution ceremony pertaining to Prime Minister Fee Reimbursement Scheme was held in CIIT Abbottabad on October 29, 2015. The ceremony was aimed at encouraging pursuit of higher education by students from less developed areas through financing of their tuition fees paid directly to universities by Prime Minister Youth Program. Cheques amounting to Rs. 02 billion were distributed to around 150 awardees
- The In-charge SFAO, CIIT Sahiwal attended meeting with secretary Punjab Worker Welfare Board in Lahore on January 12, 2016 where, the matter of outstanding amount of Worker Welfare Fund scholarship was discussed and settled. Matters about award of these scholarships for forthcoming semesters were also elaborated.

Future Plans

- Scholarship Unit Registrar office intends to launch a fully dedicated scholarship portal for students. This portal shall carry details and eligibility criteria, FAQ's of all the scholarships offered in CIIT campuses along with provision of online submission of applications for various scholarship programs. Any news pertaining to launch of new scholarship or phase of existing scholarship shall be placed as well on the portal. Portal shall be linked with scholarship pages on Facebook and twitter for maximum publicizing on social media. Moreover, success stories of our scholarship Alumni shall also be placed on portal for motivation and inspiration of existing scholarship recipients.
- To improve fund disbursement mechanism throughout CIIT campuses for timely release of funds to the scholarship recipients.
- A To expand scholarship net by creating new opportunities for launching new scholarship programs with support of different donor agencies. In this regard, MOU's shall be signed with different donor agencies to promote the awareness and cause of scholarships.
- ▲ Strengthening SFAO in campuses and bringing dedicated staff for running the affairs of scholarships.
- Establishing stringent monitoring controls pertaining to scholarship affairs across all CIIT campuses.



CHAPTER 15

Health Center/ Medical Facilities

Medical Facilities

Healthcare of the students and staff of CIIT has always been a priority. Keeping this in view, CIIT Medical Center was established in 2009 functioning under the supervision of a qualified, experienced and competent Medical Team.

It is a three beds observatory providing free first aid medical treatment and consultation to the patients. There are four medical doctors, three trained staff nurses and two trained paramedics. It is operational 06 days a week.

The activities carried out by the medical center include provision of first aid services to the students and staff of CIIT, provision of free medicines to all patients, provision of medical cover during official conferences and meetings, and arranging various healthcare awareness programs/lectures. During the reporting period, following activities were organized by the center:

- → Medical checkup of CIIT drivers was facilitated at medical centre from October 19-29, 2015
- ▲ CIIT Hostel kitchen staff was screened for various communicable diseases during October 2015
- Basic First Aid training with fully equipped first aid box was provided to Hostel staff in November 2015
- Free Eye Camp was organized in collaboration with Al Shifa Eye Trust Hospital from March 21-22, 2016
- An Allergy Awareness Campaign was arranged during the allergy season in March/April 2016
- ▲ Blood donation camps were arranged
- The facilities available at the center are ECG, nebulization, blood sugar checking, eyesight checking, dressing/stitches, BP monitoring, maintaining I/V line, injections including Tetanus Vaccination etc. and fully equipped ambulance

The center treats various injuries (cuts, abrasions, blunt trauma etc), minor road accidents, fever, respiratory tract infections, gastro intestinal tract problems, various gynae problems, burns, dermatitis/scabies, headaches, hypertension, signs of breathlessness/allergy, diarrhea, diabetes, minor anxiety, and depression etc.

A referral mechanism is in place for shifting of patients to tertiary care hospitals through a well equipped CIIT ambulance.

Dental Unit Department at CIIT Islamabad is operational since May 2015. In a period of one year from July 2015 onwards the presenting complaints treated at department is 3,457. A new sterilization machine

was also installed which is doing sterilization according to the latest methods having the protocols of W.H.O during the reporting period. The Unit is providing free dental oral medicines to students and faculty members and doing multiple dental procedures. Following are the awareness activities arranged during the reporting period:

- ▲ Techniques Of Tooth Brushing
- Oral Sign And Symptoms Of Tuberculosis
- Dental Emergencies (Community Related Dental Problems)
- ▲ Important Instructions for maintaining Dental Hygiene
- Tips to prevent Dental Cavities
- ▲ Biggest causes of Tooth Sensitivity
- Medical-Dental Connection (Impact Of Dental Health On Life)
- ▲ Dental problems of Thalasseamic Patients
- ▲ Effects Of Tobacco On Oral Health
- Awareness Seminar On Tobacco Related Oral & Systemic Health Issues
- World Oral Day Celebration Awareness activity
- Awareness Walk in CIIT
- Awareness Dental Camp

Medical center at CIIT Abbottabad treated 7,367 patients during the reporting period. It is comprised of one senior medical officer and one dispenser. All necessary facilities are available at the center whereas serious emergencies are referred to Ayub Teaching Hospital and CMH Abbottabad.



The Health Center at CIIT Lahore is functioning under the supervision of well qualified Resident Medical Officer (RMO). It provides medical support to its day scholars, hostilities, employees, visitors and the resident and their families free of cost. Emergency services are also available round the clock (24/7) for the university population. More than 100 patients are treated per day. The center is equipped with patient bed, wheel chair, blood pressure apparatus, sugar checkup apparatus, weighing machine, oxygen cylinder, nebulizer, etc. An ambulance is also available to deal with emergencies.

A dispensary with first aid facilities is working in CIIT Sahiwal and 24 hours ambulance service is also available. First Aid facility is also available at Wah, Attock, and Vehari campuses to deal with unforeseen cases.

Counseling for Stress Reduction

Counseling for Stress is frequently provided to the students and employees at all CIIT campuses through medical centers and student centers.
